Beautiful Aurora is a five-year-old mixed breed who came to HSWM as a transfer from Clarksdale, Mississippi. Along with other dogs and puppies in need, Aurora traveled several states and more than 10 hours for a chance at a forever home in our community.

Aurora had been in and out of shelters for nearly nine months. Like many animals, she struggled with the shelter environment. The noise, the busyness of people in the kennels and not having a place to call home made her stressed and anxious.

When customers looked at Aurora, they saw an animal in emotional distress – which hindered her from being adopted. Finally, after being in and out of shelters since December 2017, Aurora found her forever family in September, with a family in West Michigan.

Thurmon, an amazing one-year-old domestic shorthair cat, was found as a stray in a small apartment complex.

A kind resident who fed Thurmon brought him in one day with an eye injury. It didn't take long for us to recognize Thurmon was in deep pain. It was identified that his eye was horribly infected and needed to be removed.

During the four months Thurmon called HSWM his home, volunteers and staff fell in love with him and his easy going personality. Through his many medical procedures Thurmon was still a happy, loving cat who found his forever family.




