Humane Society of West Michigan is heavily involved in lifesaving animal transports. We regularly take in animals from all over Michigan as well as many southern states. Sometimes, a community comes together for the sake of animals who need us.

In May 2019, shelters across Michigan, in collaboration with Bissell Pet Foundation, were able to pull over 50 dogs from the overcrowded St. Landry Parish Animal Control & Rescue facility in Opelousa, Louisiana.

In addition to aiding in the transport, HSWM was able to take in a handful of adult dogs from St. Landry Parish. All dogs were spayed or neutered, treated for heartworm, and given the individual care they needed. The dogs have all since been adopted into wonderful, loving homes.
